Message from the President - Joe Harris, N1QD



June means one thing in the ham radio community: Field Day! In the 13+ years I've been involved in amateur radio, Field Day has always been the highlight of my year.

My Field Day history with BARC began in 2003, the summer after I was first licensed. The club was running their event in Larz Anderson Park in Brookline. While the location was excellent for spraying RF at the ionosphere, the sheer amount of labor involved in setting up there was unreal. Several members

would travel to Hingham to pick up supplies and load multiple vehicles up with gear. There were tents and canopies to set up so that the operators and cooks could be out of the oppressive sun. The club had to rent a porta-potty, as there were no facilities on the hill. Once the event was over, there was a return trip to Hingham to bring all the club's supplies back into storage. Larz Anderson was a good location, but with a high cost in manual labor.

This all changed in 2009, when the club moved their Field Day operations to the Bare Cove Fire Museum in Hingham. There, the club had access to shelter in the museum, a much easier setup/teardown, and (perhaps most importantly!) access to indoor plumbing. This location has proven to be an excellent site for the club to operate from. The past few years have seen new additions to the setup, like a full-time VHF / satellite station.

This June, BARC will operate from the BCFM for the eighth straight year. I'm looking forward to seeing many of you on June 25–26!

Minutes from the May General Meeting - Joe Chapman, NV1W

The Boston Amateur Radio Club's May General Meeting was held on Thursday, May 19, at Brookline Police Headquarters. Voting members present: AB1RL, KB1EKN, KB1ISG, KB1TIC, KB1QHX, KC1AXR, KO4W, N1ICN, N1QD, NA1I, NV1W, W1JJF, WA1IDA. The meeting was called to order by President Joe Harris, N1QD, at 7:31 p.m.

In the business portion of the meeting, Mark, KB1EKN (VP and Chair, Repeater Committee), reported that the 145.230 repeater is still having de-sense issues and he is planning a service trip sometime in the second half of June. Joe, N1QD, reported that the UHF DMR repeater had 30 users in the last month and that the consensus is the repeater is working well. A motion to pay John Garrett, WN9T, \$300 from the Repeater Fund for the current UHF repeater antenna carried unanimously.

Minutes from the June Business Meeting - Joe Chapman, NV1W

The Boston Amateur Radio Club's June Business Meeting was held on Thursday, June 2, at Brookline Police Headquarters. Voting members present: KB1EKN, KB1ISG, KB1QHX, N1ICN, N1QD, NA1I, NV1W. The meeting was called to order by President Joe Harris, N1QD, at 7:34 p.m.

The March, 2016, Business Meeting minutes were approved.

Officer reports:

- Joe, N1QD (President), is working on the fall meeting program. Some have raised the possibility of a Saturday meeting in the fall, and Nathaniel, KB1QHX, has suggested a foxhunt.
- Mark, KB1EKN (Vice President), mentioned the service trip for the 145.230 repeater sometime in June. He also has not ordered the 6 meter filter but will do so this week so we will have the filter for Field Day.
- Jim, N1ICN (Treasurer), reported that we have \$1100 in the Repeater Fund and \$2643.36 in the checking account.
- Joe, NV1W (Secretary), reported that we have 72 members (correction: we currently have 75 members Ed.).

Committee reports: There were no reports from Public Service or Membership Services.

Old business:

- The Nominating Committee reports via N1QD that the current slate of officers is running for re-election.
- N1QD reported that the project to update the website is stalled somewhat and a brief discussion was held. The
 consensus was that we should at the very least fix erroneous information currently on the website.
- For Field Day, Geri, KB1ISG, will order 15 pins. It was noted that KB1EKN and KB1ISG have another commitment
 on Saturday evening of Field Day so a volunteer is needed to handle Saturday dinner. NV1W asked whether we
 should consider appointing a Safety Officer, worth 100 points, and we will discuss this at the June General
 Meeting.

New business:

- Blake, K1BTH, has already received a call from The Stockyard about next year's Holiday Party. The general consensus was that we prefer January to December, and KB1EKN noted that a straw poll at this year's party was very much in favor of the January date. We will discuss in a General Meeting.
- The ARRL New England Cabinet Meeting will be held in Nashua, NH, in July and N1QD will attend.
- Boxboro is now in September, and N1QD mentioned getting a club table for the Saturday banquet, though this has not generated much enthusiasm in the past.
- N1QD mentioned the following possible programs for fall meetings: foxhunting (with a foxhunt), AMSAT, HF
 digital modes such as RTTY, and a presentation on the ARRL Field Organization.

Announcements: KB1EKN announced that he and N1QD will be participating in the ARRL June VHF Contest the weekend of June 11 at the KB1EKN shack in Hingham, and all are invited to attend. Contact him for more information.

Call for Volunteer Examiners - The BARC VE Team

We give all exams (Technician, General, and Extra). Testing is by reservation only. Please bring the following with you:


- Your current license and a photocopy for the ARRL, if you are upgrading

Note: Written tests can be taken sequentially at the same session for the same \$15 fee. The needed FCC forms will be provided.
