New DMR Talk Groups Available – Bill Barber, NE1B, via Joe Harris, N1QD

There are two new PTT talk groups available on the Club's UHF DMR repeater! See this note from Bill NE1B for the full details:

Once more, we have listened to requests for more New England only TACs or User Activated talk groups. These are PTT activated for Internal New England only. No competition trying to grab the wide area TAC310 or TAC311 on Time Slot 1. They can be used for individual or group QSOs or special events without tying up unnecessary sites.

This description from Dave, KM3T:

We have two new talkgroups for the New England DMR network:

- NETAC1 (TG 8801 Time Slot 1)
- NETAC2 (TG 8802 Time Slot 2)

These two talkgroups are PTT and are designed to be "TAC" channels internal to the New England DMR community. The talkgroups will not be distributed beyond the Boston and Augusta C-Bridges. The purpose is to have a channel to QSY to that will not compete with other individuals outside New England. The other TAC channels have become very busy and it is a better use of resources to have some internal TAC channels. One is on TS1 and one is on TS2 so the user can determine which one makes more sense to QSY to. For example, on a busy Maine repeater where ME SW is in use a lot, NETAC1 would make more sense. But if TS1 is busy, then perhaps NETAC2 would make more sense. So there is flexibility.

We have also set up holdoff timers on our bridge to implement the following rules:

- NETAC1 blocks North American and Northeast... there is no block for the WW and WWE talkgroups since they are
 on PTT anyway and not likely to conflict (and it's just too much programming) 5-minute timer
- NETAC2 blocks Statewide talkgroups, Region North, and New England Wide
- 5-minute timer

Give it a try!

- KB1EKN reported that we have not yet made a trip to work on the VHF repeater, and that the schedule depends on availability of the antenna consultant.
- The club's DMR radio has been received.

BARC on Logbook of the World - Joe Chapman, NV1W

After uploading this year's Field Day logs to Logbook of the World, W1BOS has 2,823 QSOs in the system and 691 QSL records. We have confirmations from 47 states (all but CO, ID, and NV) and 12 DXCC entities.

Call for Volunteer Examiners - The BARC VE Team

BARC could use some more Volunteer Examiners (VEs) for our exam sessions. Recently we had to scramble again to get the required three VEs for an exam session. If any unforeseen situation arises and a VE is not able to make a session we would be forced to cancel the test.

There are some BARC members who are qualified VEs that have not been participating in the testing. We urge these VEs to become active. If you can spare one night every couple of months please come to a session.

We can also surely use additional VEs. The test procedure for qualification is simple. Materials are available from the ARRL and the examination is an open book test. Hams with General and Amateur Extra class licenses are eligible to become VEs, though only Extras can administer tests for General and Amateur Extra licenses. Band conditions were decent on 80 thru 20, but 15 and 10 were not up to their full potential. We had better luck with 15 on Sunday, but







- A pen and a calculator (if you want to)
- \$15.00 (good for all the tests you take at that session, except for retests)

Note: Written tests can be taken sequentially at the same session for the same \$15 fee. The needed FCC forms will be provided.
