#### Call for Volunteer Examiners – The BARC VE Team

BARC could use some more Volunteer Examiners (VEs) for our exam sessions. Recently we had to scramble again to get the required three VEs for an exam session. If any unforeseen situation arises and a VE is not able to make a session we would be forced to cancel the test.

There are some BARC members who are qualified VEs that have not been participating in the testing. We urge these VEs to become active. If you can spare one night every couple of months please come to a session.

We can also surely use additional VEs. The test procedure for qualification is simple. Materials are available from the ARRL and the examination is an open book test. Hams with General and Amateur Extra class licenses are eligible to become VEs, though only Extras can administer tests for General and Amateur Extra licenses. #### How to Register as a Boston Marathon Volunteer - Brett Smith, AB1RL

Mark your calendars! Volunteer registration for the 2017 Boston Marathon will open January 4. Sign up with the BAA on their web site at <a href="http://www.baa.org/utilities/volunteer">http://www.baa.org/utilities/volunteer</a>. You can even go there and bookmark the site now, so it's easier to find next month.

If you've volunteered at a BAA event before, you'll get an e-mail from them with more information about how to register as a returning volunteer. Otherwise, follow the prompts for a first-time volunteer. When you're asked for an assignment preference, just make sure you select at least one of the "Ham Radios" assignments.

I know a lot of people come back for the same assignment year after year. That's great to see: having that experience of handling the same responsibilities in a variety of situations is invaluable, and contributes a lot to the event. If that's you, please join us again.

But maybe you're looking to tackle completely new challenges. Maybe you even stopped volunteering because it got boring. Or maybe you're just looking for a change of scenery. Fortunately the Marathon is a large event with something for every volunteer. If I just described you, I encourage you to sign up and request an assignment in a different area than you've worked before. We can't guarantee specific placement, but we do our level best to accommodate everyone. It helps if you leave a brief note in the comments when you sign up.

#### Minutes from the December, 2016 Business Meeting – Joe Chapman, NV1W

The Boston Amateur Radio Club held a business meeting on Thursday, December 1 at 7:30 pm at Brookline Police Headquarters in Brookline. The following members were present: K1BTH, KB1EKN, KB1ISG, KO4W, N1ICN, N1QD, NA1I, NV1W, WA1IDA. Following a renewal envelope stuffing project the meeting was called to order by President Joe Harris, N1QD, at 8:30 pm.

#### Officer reports:

- Joe, N1QD (President) reported that he is setting up a speaker schedule for the spring.
- Jim, N1ICN (Treasurer) reported that we have \$1100.68 in the savings account (repeater fund) and \$1537.74 in the checking account. We have received \$50 from the Harvard Wireless Club for Field Day.
- Joe, NV1W (Secretary) reported that we have one new member and two renewals for 2017.
- Mark, KB1EKN (VP and Repeater Committee) reported that the six-can duplexer for the VHF repeater is tuned and ready to install.
- Bob, WA1IDA, on behalf of the Public Service committee, reported that there are no more events in 2016 and the season will start up again in April.

A discussion was held about moving money from the checking account into the repeater fund. It was decided to table the matter until March, when most renewals and donations will have been received.

The Holiday Party will be on Sunday, January 8, 2017, at The Stockyard in Allston, from 1:00 to 4:00 pm. A motion was passed to charge attendees \$25 per person and have the club cover the rest, excluding bar bills.

A discussion was held concerning the website. N1QD and NV1W will investigate and come up with a plan of action.

K1BTH offered to investigate making BARC logo jackets available for purchase and will report back at the March business meeting.

N1QD reported that he has put a spreadsheet up on Google docs to track club assets and their current locations. A lengthy discussion was held on the current status of a 2 meter combiner which the club used for public service events in the past.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:40 pm.

- Your current license and a photocopy for the ARRL, if you are upgrading
- Any CSCEs you are claiming, and a photocopy of them
- Valid picture ID or two valid non-picture IDs
- A pen and a calculator (if you want to)
- \$15.00 (good for all the tests you take at that session, except for retests)

Note: Written tests can be taken sequentially at the same session for the same \$15 fee. The needed FCC forms will be provided.


