For me, at least, the holidays went by fairly quickly – never did get saturated with the jingly music. Having to move the near-record snow from one place to another did divert my attention. I hope you and your family had pleasant and rewarding holidays.

Time to look ahead to making BARC fun and productive for you in 2008. Resolutions don't work... determination does. The club exists only for you. Want something out of it? You get out what you put in. The club has a reservoir of knowledge, skills and excitement. These are contained in the people like yourself who want to make ham radio fun and productive.

As has been said many times, ham radio has many facets. Some interest you, some do not. However, some of the facets may be of interest to you, if only you had a clue about them. Where do you expand your present knowledge, and where do you gain brand new knowledge? It's in the club. Have fun!

The season of ham public service is rapidly approaching. New to ham radio? Old hand at it? Helping your community with critical communications is the place to serve and have fun at the same time. Athletic events, charity events, large crowds need ham support. Pick up your radio and join in.

Field Day is 28-29 June. Not too early to start thinking about it. We don't need all the details worked out yet, but there are items to be dealt with. Like – is Field Day relevant, or even necessary? Should we participate, or should we prepare even if we don't set up? Field Day started more than 75 years ago as an annual demonstration of emergency preparedness (with a little evolution toward being a contest). Fun and experience are part of the deal. What do you think?

Speaking of experience, two things are constantly wrestled with when setting up stations for Field Day and other major (generally outdoor) events. Coaxial cable takes a beating and deteriorates. Ropes used for guys get cut, knotted and tangled. We tested all our coax and discarded the bad ones (most of what we had). All the rope went into the trash. We have bought new coax and new rope – lots of both. The coax has a polyethylene jacket rather than the usual PVC, reducing deterioration. We still do not have the perfect solution for getting the line over the tops of trees.

We did have an error in the December issue of *The SPARC*. Because of miscommunication, the announcement of the speaker for our January General meeting was incorrect. Warren, K2ORS, will present his program on the low frequencies later in the spring.

BARC Volunteer Exam Sessions

The Boston Amateur Radio Club usually holds monthly VE sessions on the second Monday of each month. Sessions are usually held at 7:00 pm at the Pierce School, 50 School St in Brookline, Room 110, next to the cafeteria. A map is shown on page 5.

If the Brookline Public Schools (or the Pierce School itself) is closed due to inclement weather or other problems, the exam session for that month will be canceled.

There is a free parking garage at the circular driveway. If driving, enter School St from the Washington St side (opposite 394 Washington), rather than from Harvard St. Check: www.barc.org/barc/school_map.gif: for more info.

For those traveling via the **T**, take the "D" branch of the Green Line to the Brookline Village station. Walk north along Harvard St 0.2 miles to School St, then turn left. The Pierce School is on the left. The #66 bus runs on Harvard St, crossing School St.

Talk in on 145.230 MHz (-), PL 88.5 Hz.

We give all exams (Technician, General, and Extra). You don't need to pre-register. Please bring the following with you:

- Your current license *and a photocopy for the ARRL*, if you are upgrading
- Any CSCEs you are claiming, and a photocopy of them
- Valid ID (picture ID preferred)
- A pen and a calculator (if you want to)
- \$14.00 (good for all the tests you take at that session, except for retests)
- Code and written tests can be taken together at the same session for the same \$14 fee.

The needed FCC forms will be provided.


