## The Spirit of Christmas Past -- Tom Bertolino, KB1P

It's December 1971, South Viet Nam, Quang Tri Province, part of the rocket belt about 15 - 20 km northwest of Hue. This is where elements of the Delta Company 2nd Bn. 327th Inf, 101st Airborne Div were on patrol. It's the middle of the monsoon season in this hilly jungle area.

It was a difficult time to be a combat solider in South Viet Nam. We spent Thanksgiving Day on patrol and missed the traditional turkey dinner. Morale was low. It was the holiday season. This will be the first holiday season away from home for many soldiers in this "draft" Army. We had been soaking wet in the middle of the jungle for over a month. We were eating cold "C" rations and fighting a war that no one wanted. We wondered how everyone was doing in the real world. (We called the States the real world because we thought we were living a bad dream.) How are the folks back home? Are they safe, are they dry, and what are they doing to get ready for the holidays? We worried about our families back home.

We got our first break in the middle of December when we found out that we were being sent to help guard a Fire Base later in the month. At least we would have a chance to dry out, eat a hot meal, and enjoy the "comfort" of a bunker to keep us out of the rain. The plan was that we would be picked up by helicopters, weather permitting, on the 22nd and flown to a landing zone just outside of the Fire Base. All we had to do was get to the pick-up zone on time. There was no doubt in our minds that we could do so and we did.

We arrived at the Fire Base on time, and we were assigned a section of the perimeter to secure. During our briefing by the base commander we were told that our unit could enter the base's lottery. The prizes were MARS calls back to the states on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. We all entered the lottery and started to think about the holidays back home with our families. The biggest problem the troops had was deciding whom they were going to call if they won. Unit morale was starting to get better. We began to share stories about our last holidays back home. We all agreed on one thing, that is, when we told our stories to our family and friends we would avoid any talk about our upcoming tour in Viet Nam.

The drawing was held on the morning of the 24th. Since my squad was on a security patrol outside the base, I did not find out that I won the Christmas Eve MARS call until that afternoon. I was happier than a pig in ?!%@. I was going to call my wife whom I married before I went to Viet Nam. Since my departure she had been living with her parents. The call was planned for 2100 hrs. I had no idea what time it was in the states or for that manner what day it was. I didn't care. My only worry was that the base might be attacked when I was on the phone with my wife. It was the longest seven hours I ever spent waiting for that call. When the time came for the call, I was in my bunker, it was raining and it was so dark that you could not see three feet in front of you. Almost on time the TA-312 in the bunker rang. It was an Amateur Radio operator on the phone. He was somewhere in the States. He wanted the phone number I wanted to call. While he was dialing the number he explained the radio procedures used during the call and the call would only last for 3 minutes. The phone was answered after the 4th ring. It was my mother-in-law. It was probably the only time I was glad to hear her voice. The ham explained that he was calling for me and this call was for my wife. My mother-in-law put my wife on the phone. Until this day the only thing I remember about the call is my wife saying "over."

I didn't know how much that phone call meant to my wife and our families when my wife explained to them that I would be on a Fire Base for Christmas. It was the next year's holiday season when I found out. We were all at my parent's house celebrating, when someone brought up my call from the Fire Base. They said it made their Christmas because they were all worried about how I was getting on and what I was doing during Christmas. After hearing from me they felt that I was safe for now being on a Fire Base and that I would have a good meal on Christmas.

I do not know who the ham was, but he made Christmas, 1971, a happy one for one grunt and his family. Thank you whoever you were, and thanks to all those hams who took the time to relay phone calls to lonely GIs everywhere.

**Treasurer's Report:** Jim, N1ICN, reported that the bank balance was \$ 3,803.46. Tom presented the 2009 Balance Sheet which was reviewed and discussed. It was noted that there were a number of onetime items purchased.

Secretary's Report: Jim, KB1JBJ, reported that there was nothing to report.

**Membership Services' Report:** Linda, NA1I, reported that she was not getting the list of new hams, so that she can send out new membership packages to these hams. Bob, WA1IDA, explained that the problem is with AARL site and has been corrected.

Linda, NA1I, will send out a one page note to new hams, welcoming them into the world of ham radio and BARC. She will include the URL to the latest *The SPARC* newsletter.

Repeater Report: Tom, KB1P reported that 145.230, is working fine and that Monday Night Net has not noticed any problems.

On the 440 side, Mike, N1IST, reported that the new frequency pairs (443.550 / 448.550, CTCSS 110.9) have been programmed into the repeater and the cans have been re-tuned. The receiver still needs further internal tuning.

Mike, N1IST, reported that the club purchased and owns the 2 meter repeater and antenna; the feed line is part of the building services. The 440 repeater was donated and the club purchased the power supply; he was not sure about the antenna. Mike is also putting together an inventory of the club's equipment at the repeater site, so we can look into the possibility of insuring with ARRL.


