# Message from the President - Joe Chapman, NV1W

As most of you are aware, Eric Falkof, K1NUN, became a silent key, suddenly and unexpectedly, on November 17.

Eric was a long-time active member of the club, a past President, and a VE. A ham for 52 years, he was a well-known figure in the amateur radio world, especially here in New England. He was a frequent speaker at club meetings all over the region and worked the Boston Marathon for years. Recently he was volunteering at the Zola Center, where he started a ham radio club, and at the Museum of Science.

Linda, NA1I, and I attended Eric's funeral at his temple in Wayland. We heard family, colleagues, and friends--including one from the amateur radio world--pay tribute to a fine, kind and generous man. Hams have the good fortune to have the word "Elmer", a concept the other speakers had to struggle to express.

One of my favorite memories of Eric happened a little over a year ago. Linda had convened her roving W5YI VE team for a session up at Harvard. There were no takers that night, so Eric, Bill, W1PL, and I headed over to the Harvard Wireless Club's shack for a tour. After seeing the station, we headed up to the attic. Among the treats were a station license issued by Herbert Hoover (as Secretary of Commerce in the 1920's).

Eric of course started bounding around like a nine-year-old thirty minutes after a successful session of trick-or-treating, blowing the dust off things, and offering a continuous stream of commentary. What the thing was, who made it, what other things they made, how many of them he had back at home, what it was worth. Along the way Bill and I learned how to identify mysterious tubes (put them in the freezer for a while, then take them out and breathe on them, and you'll be able to read the legends when the glass fogs up). We also learned how to reform old electrolytics (attach a Variac and bring the voltage up very slowly).

I conducted a brief service of remembrance for Eric at a session of the Monday night BARC net, and I understand there will be further on-air commemorations.

I've expressed the condolences of the club to his wife Nancy, KB1OCP, with whom we share the shock of losing him so unexpectedly, and so many good memories.

Hail, fairwell, and 73, Eric..

# ARRL Centennial: ARRL Granted Use of W1ØØAW for League's Centennial-- The ARRL Letter, December 5, 2013

The FCC has authorized the Maxim Memorial Station W1AW to also use the call sign W1ØAW during 2014, the ARRL's centennial year. Contacts made from the Maxim Memorial Station in Newington, from regional Centennial conventions, and during the IARU HF Championship will use W1ØAW, with portable designators as appropriate. The "W1AW WAS" operations throughout 2014 from each of the 50 states will use W1AW, not W1ØØAW. Bulletins and code practice transmissions during 2014 also will still use W1AW.

Contacts with W1ØØAW will be worth 100 points in the ARRL Centennial QSO Party. To help kick off the ARRL Centennial, special W1ØØAW activity will begin at 0500 UTC on January 1, 2014 (midnight in Newington), and will include participation in ARRL's Straight Key Night; one CW station will use Hiram Percy Maxim's straight key. Activity will continue throughout New Year's Day.


## Quarterly Business Meetings -- Bob Salow, WA1IDA

We give all exams (Technician, General, and Extra). Testing is by reservation only. Please bring the following with you:

- Your current license and a photocopy for the ARRL, if you are upgrading
- Any CSCEs you are claiming, and a photocopy of them
- Valid ID (picture ID preferred)
- A pen and a calculator (if you want to)
- \$15.00 (good for all the tests you take at that session, except for retests)

Note: Written tests can be taken sequentially at the same session for the same \$15 fee. The needed FCC forms will be provided.
