## Message from the President - Joe Chapman, NV1W

It's been great to see so many new members at our meetings this fall, and I've been delighted to receive email and phone calls from folks who are either getting started in the hobby or who have recently upgraded to General and are getting into HF.

As many of you know I do a lot of QRP work (low power, five watts or less), mainly due to the fact that I love my KX1 and KX3, and like to operate outdoors where the only power source is a battery that you have to carry. I also like the idea of being able to work DX using barely enough power to run a night light and a simple wire antenna. It is easy to drown in a pileup, though I have high hopes for bagging K1N on Navassa in January.

I was delighted to be able to convince Dennis Marandos, K1LGQ, the President of the New England QRP Club, to come and speak at our general meeting this month. Dennis is a wonderful speaker, and his talk promises to be informative and a lot of fun. Come and join us even if you have no intention of turning down your RF power or leaving the comfort of your home shack when it's ten degrees outside this winter.

I also want to draw your attention to what is turning into BARC weekend, the first weekend in December, the 6th and 7th. Last things first: this year's holiday party will be held at the Stockyard in Allston on Sunday the 7th. There will be the usual good things to eat and drink. I myself am not always able to make Sunday events due to prior commitments, but I will attempt to swan in for a cameo appearance.

On Saturday the 6th we will operate from the Great Blue Hill Observatory in Milton in observance of SKYWARN Recognition Day. As one of the National Weather Service stations, we'll actually be one of the stations everyone wants to contact, so you might even be able to try running a modest pileup. Last year we had Qs with Edmonton (-24 degrees) and Greenland (roughly the same temperature as Milton).

I suspect we'll be putting out a full 100W, though I may bring my KX3 (last year the FT-897 started hissing like a deranged Canada goose when we tried to use it on 40m). You will, however, be able to put your alfresco operating knowledge to use by helping to set up. Contact Mark Duff, KB1EKN, or me if you want to help.

## BARC to Participate in Skywarn Recognition Day 2014 - Mark Duff, KB1EKN

On December 6th, 2014 and for the 12th consecutive year, BARC will once again participate in Skywarn Recognition Day. SRD is a joint event support by the ARRL and the National Weather Service where weather stations and weather buffs from across the country contact each other for fun and to promote the Skywarn Program. Our station will be located at the

summit of Great Blue Hill in Milton MA.

For several decades, hams have assisted the National Weather Service by providing real-time reports of severe weather and storm conditions. Although the NWS operates a network of 120 Doppler radars to track severe storms, at greater ranges weather radar has a difficult time sampling conditions close to the ground. The information radio operators located near a storm provide plays a key role in aiding forecasters. Stations will exchange signal reports, location and a brief description of the current weather at their respective locations ("sunny," partly cloudy," "windy," etc.). BARC will be on the air from approximately 0900 to 1500 local time.

The event itself is a great way in a low-key environment to make HF contacts and get your feet wet in the HF Spectrum.

In past years we have endured all kinds of weather including warm and cold days, clear and cloudy days, and yes even a blizzard.

Access to the summit is gained by a 20 minute hike from the base of Great Blue Hill located on RT 138 next to the DCR Trailside Museum or if you arrive early in the day by car.


## Quarterly Business Meetings -- Bob Salow, WA1IDA

- Your current license and a photocopy for the ARRL, if you are upgrading
- Any CSCEs you are claiming, and a photocopy of them
- Valid ID (picture ID preferred)
- A pen and a calculator (if you want to)
- \$15.00 (good for all the tests you take at that session, except for retests)

Note: Written tests can be taken sequentially at the same session for the same \$15 fee. The needed FCC forms will be provided.
