Message from the President - Joe Chapman, NV1W

I took my first license test at the Custom House in Boston in the mid-seventies. In those days you had to travel to one of the FCC regional offices to take a test, which included several terrifying minutes of a steely-eyed government inspector sending you Morse Code. It was towards the end of the slide rule era, and I may have even taken my faithful Pickett N4-ES to the test session.

I have a certain nostalgia for the FCC of that era, when the chief of a regional office had the title of Engineer in Charge and none of the Commissioners was under the impression that Ohm's Law has something to do with meditation.

It's hard to think of a more successful policy change than the introduction of the Volunteer Examiner system. The latest ARRL letter reports that licensing in the US has reached an all-time high of 726,275, approximately 83% of whom were in whatever pileup I was in trying to contact K1N in Navassa last month. Maria Somma, AB1FM, reports that the ARRL VEC conducted more than 7000 VE sessions last year for the first time. It hard to imagine that if license exams were as much of a hassle as they were in the old days the numbers would be anywhere near this good.

BARC continues to hold VE sessions under the able leadership of Linda, NA1I, and Jim, N1ICN. Jim probably leads the club in terms of the sheer number of VE sessions he's participated in, and I keep waiting to see him appear in the list of stellar VEs in QST. We have a reliable and dedicated group of core volunteers--if only all the examinees were to show up so dependably--who reflect well on the club and the hobby.

Extra class licensees who aren't accredited VEs can contact Linda to find out what becoming a VE entails. Members of the club who don't hold an Extra class license are welcome to try a VE session out for themselves. Those who are nostalgic for the old days should contact me and I'll bring a slide rule for you to use.

Members may recall last fall when the club solicited signal reports for the 145.23 repeater. At that time we had just installed a Laird FG1443 to replace the Andrew DB224 that had been damaged the pervious winter. The reports we received were not indicative of the excellent performance we want the club's flagship repeater to be known for. With this in mind, the club passed a motion to allocate funds to purchase a new DB224. The antenna was received in early October and installed on October 24. Initial reports have been **very** positive, but we have only heard from some of the frequent users. In addition, the UHF repeater has been on the air since spring, but has not been particularly active.

Minutes of the March BARC Business Meeting- Joe Harris, N1QD

The March Boston Amateur Radio Club Business Meeting was held on March 5 at the Cambridgeside Galleria food court. The meeting was attended by:

The meeting was called to order at 7:40PM.

President's Report: Joe, NV1W, reported that speakers are lined up thru the June BARC general meeting. Additionally, any club members seeking to run for office are encouraged to contact him. Finally, the repeater fund that was described in the December SPARC is off to a good start, with many generous donations from club members.

Vice President's / Repeater Report: Mark, KB1EKN, described an intermittent issue with noise on distant stations accessing the 145.23 repeater. He believes that it has been happening during periods of high winds.

Secretary's Report: Joe, N1QD reported that as of Feb. 21 there have been 41 member renewals. He reminds the club members that the dues grace period ends on March 31.

Treasurer's Report: Jim N1ICN reported that as of March 4 the club's balance is \$3872.12.

Old Business

A discussion was held regarding the repeater fund. The main issue was whether the club should open up a second account specifically for the fund. It was decided that the club would appropriate the agreed upon \$500 as well as the member donations into a separate repeater account. Jim N1ICN and Joe NV1W will look into opening a second account at Cambridge Trust, and Linda NA1I will investigate Eastern Bank's offerings.

New Business

Geri KB1ISG reported that the Bare Cove Fire Museum has been booked for Field Day weekend. She also informed the officers that the MBTA has started running weekend service on the Greenbush Line, so there will be easy T access to Field Day. Mark KB1EKN recommended that the club send out Field Day PR at least one month in advance of the event this year.

The meeting adjourned at 8:40PM.

Dear Friends of NEAR-Fest:

It is with great regret and sadness that I must inform the radio amateurs and electronic hobbyists of New England that the NEAR-Fest Board of Directors finds it necessary to POSTPONE the FreeFest aspect of NEAR-FEST XVII that was scheduled for May 2015. It will be held at a later date. However, first and foremost, I want to assure everyone that <u>NEAR-Fest XVII</u> <u>WILL TAKE PLACE AS SCHEDULED</u> on May 1st and 2nd, 2015, at the Deerfield NH Fairgrounds. NEAR-Fest XVIII will also be held as scheduled on October 16th and 17th, 2015.

The Directors made the difficult decision to POSTPONE the FreeFest due to a legal issue that has arisen since the FreeFest was announced last October. The matter is being addressed professionally; however the funds that would have financed the FreeFester may now be needed to resolve this issue at hand. There was no other option open to us. It is important for everyone to understand that there are no issues or problems with the Deerfield Fair Association; in fact our relationship with them is better than ever.

I want to personally assure you all that the FreeFest will be rescheduled as soon as possible once this issue has been resolved. The entire NEAR-Fest management team is committed to, and is looking forward to, hosting the FreeFest, in its original spirit, to thank all our loyal attendees and the amateur radio community for the support since 2007. We appreciate your understanding and continued support. We hope to be able to post an update about FreeFest on our website before the end of the year. Advance tickets and inside parking passes will be on sale in the usual places starting in April. Check our Web site (www.near-fest.com) for more details.

To summarize: NEAR-Fest XVII <u>WILL TAKE PLACE</u> on May 1st and 2nd, 2015, exactly as scheduled, Admission will be the same as always, \$10 per person and \$10 for an inside parking pass. NEAR-Fest XVIII will also take place as scheduled on October 16th and 17th, 2015. The FreeFest that was planned to take place as a part of NEAR-Fest XVII is POSTPONED until a later date.

We give all exams (Technician, General, and Extra). Testing is by reservation only. Please bring the following with you:

- Your current license and a photocopy for the ARRL, if you are upgrading
- Any CSCEs you are claiming, and a photocopy of them
- Valid ID (picture ID preferred)
- A pen and a calculator (if you want to)
- \$15.00 (good for all the tests you take at that session, except for retests)

Note: Written tests can be taken sequentially at the same session for the same \$15 fee. The needed FCC forms will be provided.
