## Message from the President - Joe Chapman, NV1W

This will be my last message as President of BARC. Fortunately for me, I seem to have survived three years of the presidency, and fortunately for all of us, BARC seems to have survived three years of my leadership.

A recurring theme of both these messages and my term in office has been the need to extend my thanks to those members who are so devoted to the club. I have benefited from the wise counsel of my predecessors, especially my immediate predecessor, Linda, NA1I, and our founding President, Bob, WA1IDA. I have constantly relied on our other officers as well as those whom I have had the privilege to appoint. Finally, there have been several members who have been especially encouraging and supportive. We have a good assortment of spares and over \$1000 in the repeater fund. The response to this year's drive for donations to that fund exceeded all our expectations, and I am grateful to those who added a little extra to their checks this year, as well as those who made generous gifts.

Our public service program, which has been a vital part of the club since its inception, continues to be something we can all be proud of. Brett, AB1RL, is doing an outstanding job as Public Service chair, one that reflects well not just on BARC, but on amateur radio in general.

Field Day continues to be a high point of the year. Mark Duff, KB1EKN, and Geri Duff, KB1ISG, put in many hours to make the weekend a success. Joe, N1QD, oversees the technical challenges of setting up a multi-operator station along with racking up most of our points. Of course, it wouldn't be Field Day without the many members and friends of the club who join us down in Hingham for the event.

On a less festive note, two of our members became silent keys during my term, Eric Falkof, K1NUN, and Frank Murphy, N1DHW. I am grateful for their devotion to the club and for their friendship. I've used Eric's method of re-forming geriatric filter capacitors with a Variac, and maybe someday I'll have use his trick of putting vacuum tubes in the freezer so their markings will be visible when they fog up. May both Eric and Frank rest in peace.


## Field Day is This Month!

## **UHF Repeater Update**

BARC's UHF repeater has been on the air for close to a year and a half now. In that time, it has not been particularly active. In an effort to boost traffic and interest, the club voted at the June business meeting to transition the repeater to digital, running DMR (also called MOTOTRBO). The club's repeater is DMR-capable, though it has been running in analog mode since it was put into service in early 2014. Once the repeater has been reprogrammed to DMR, the intent will be to connect to to the DMR-MARC network via the New England Digital Emergency network, a group founded by Bill Barber, NE1B. Bill was the club's guest speaker at the May general meeting. Once the transition is complete, users will be able to have QSOs locally, within the region, or across the nation. More details will be available over the summer, and will be published in upcoming issues of the SPARC. Up-to-the-moment details will be posted to the yahoo group as soon as they are available, so see the post elsewhere in the SPARC for information on joining the group. ## Minutes of the June 4 BARC Business Meeting - Joe Harris, N1QD

The meeting was called to order at 1931.

**Treasurer's report:** Jim N1ICN reported the club's balance at \$3639.95, including the repeater fund. The only planned expense on the horizon is food for Field Day. \$50 was sent to the New England QSO Party for plaque sponsorship. Linda NA1I e-filed the club's tax exempt status with the IRS.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

**Club Bank Accounts:** Linda NA1I reported that the BARC funds will be transferred from Cambridge Trust to Eastern Bank. Two separate accounts will be set up: a checking account for general expenses and a savings for the repeater fund.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

**Newsletter:** A discussion was held regarding the publication interval of the SPARC. With the exception of meeting announcements and the President's column, there had been little content submitted for publication.0 The argument was made that if the newsletter was published quarterly, it would likely be richer in content, with meeting notices being distributed via email and the web site. Bob, WA1IDA cautioned that the newsletter is a critical means of communication from the club officers to its membership, and it would be unwise to reduce the number of issues published annually. Joe Chapman will be taking over as newsletter editor, it was agreed to table discussion on the issue until the September business meeting when he could be present.

Proposal to change the UHF repeater to DMR: Joe N1QD proposed that the club's UHF repeater should be converted to DMR from analog. His argument was that the repeater had been back on the air for over a year, and was largely unused. Converting to DMR would provide a differentiator for the club, and would potentially be a draw for new members. Because the club's UHF repeater was a DMR-capable Motorola XPR8300, the only cost involved would be providing internet access to the site. Options considered were cellular internet and pairing with other tenants, or with the host site itself. A motion was made by Mark, KB1EKN, and seconded by Joe, N1QD, to convert the repeater to DMR pending the diagnosis of the intermod issue with the VHF repeater. The motion was passed unanimously.

**Field Day:** Mark, KB1EKN, reported that the club was set to use the Bare Cove Fire Museum for Field Day again this year. Operational plans will be similar to last year (3A with a VHF station). Further planning will be held at the June General meeting.

**Future of the Club:** a discussion was held regarding the club's direction, and its future activities. In particular, the officers want to provide an environment for club members to have discussions, be social, and be able to provide assistance to new hams and those interested in ham radio. Joe, N1QD suggested that the club make a stronger effort to promote its Yahoo group. He agreed to write an article promoting the Yahoo group in the SPARC. Hank, K1QK, suggested that the club consider having a meeting on Saturday morning to make city traffic less of a factor for members living in the surrounding communities. Joe, N1QD, suggested that a purely social gathering such as a breakfast might be a good way to get the club together. It was agreed to plan a breakfast for later in the summer, with the possibility of making it a recurring event, depending on its success.

The meeting adjourned at 2145.

- \$15.00 (good for all the tests you take at that session, except for retests)

Note: Written tests can be taken sequentially at the same session for the same \$15 fee. The needed FCC forms will be provided.
