## 20 Years Ago in The SPARC – Joe Chapman, NV1W

In July, 1998, Ed Hennessy, N1PBA, wrote his first message as President of BARC — Mike Ardai, N1IST, provided a recap of Field Day — Having two generators at Field Day was deemed a success because of the added load of the coffee pots — Logging was messy because not everybody logged via computer and there wasn't a standard paper form — Newly appointed SEC Steve Schwarm, W3EVE, wrote about the reawakening of EMA ARES — BARC had 161 members — And elsewhere, the second Harry Potter book, Harry Potter and the Chamber of Secrets, was published.

## 3D Printing - Joe Chapman, NV1W

For most of my operating I use various wire antennas on my roofdeck. Setup involves running a length of coax from my apartment to the roof and both setup and teardown require a good twenty minutes each. For a quick check of a band or to try working a DX station that's just popped up I take an AlexLoop up to the roof with my KX3, so if the bands prove to be dead as disco at least I haven't invested 40 minutes.

An AlexLoop is a magnetic loop antenna, designed by Alex, PY1AHD. for 10 to 40 meters. The good thing about magnetic loops is they don't require a counterpoise and they can be tuned to a decent SWR. The bad thing is the bandwidth is small—you might have to retune every 20 kHz—and they're a little like Episcopalians in that they don't like getting too close to people. Since the AlexLoop is made to be held in the hand this personality quirk can be annoying. The obvious solution is to mount it on a tripod, which poses the simple problem of adapting a camera tripod to a fiberglass tube.

A Google search led me to some designs for 3D printed adapters that looked promising. I found one on Thingiverse (https://www.thingiverse.com/) that uses a 1/4"-20 mounting



coupler to attach to a standard camera tripod screw. And, wonder or wonders, you can click through to someone who will 3D print the device and mail it to you. I used Treatstock, a broker that connects people who want to have something printed with someone who has a printer. I found a shop in Gray, Maine, willing to make the part for about \$7. Adding on shipping and a commission for Treatstock brought the tab to \$11 and change. The part arrived in a few days.

There was a link on the project page to the mounting coupler to its page on Amazon. While I generally prefer to buy hardware from an actual store, I'm also aware of my tendency to buy the wrong thing, so I went with Amazon. That part also arrived in a short order.

So, part in hand, I went upstairs to my roof to give it a try. Setup went quickly and tuning on the CW end of 40 meters took the usual minute or so of fiddling around. One of the regular CW Ops short CW contests was on, which I wasn't quite ready to jump into, but the Midwest was coming in nice and clear.


