Next QSO Today Virtual Ham Expo Scheduled for March – Doc Kinne, KE1ML

The QSO Virtual Ham Expo is back and will return on 13 March.

The first QSO Virtual Ham Expo was a success. It ended up having over 16,000 attendees. Indeed, it may have been a larger success than its organizers were counting on. But it looks like they've risen to this new challenge.

The preliminary slate of speakers look interesting. They include Carol Perry, WB2MGP, hosting the Youth Forum. The topics look even better and include such things as:

- The Storied History of the Ham Radio Callsign
- Using Drones for Amateur Radio
- The Search for Earhart's L10E
- Introduction to Ham Radio Satellites
- Detecting Earthquakes Using HF Receivers
- An Overview of Parks on the Air



These are the topics that caught my eye – your interests may vary.

There will be live virtual kit building workshops. These will operate by having you physically get the kit beforehand, and then have it in hand when the workshop takes place so you can build and follow along.

They're also mentioning "new video technology to enable a better experience when engaging with exhibitors." I may attend just to see how this works. One of my main reasons for attending conventions is to be able physically see and experience new equipment because I'm never quite satisfied with magazine ads.

While I, like so many others, am looking forward to a return of the "old normal" with ham conventions, I do find myself hoping that the larger ones may be able to retain a bit of the virtual presence that we've been able to develop, of necessity, over the last year.
