Designer Needed for 2023 13 Colonies MA K2H QSL Card – Larry Krainson, W1AST & Doc Kinne, KE1ML

The Thirteen Colonies Special Contest commemorates the original 13 colonies and Great Britain. For KE1ML, it was the first contest that station ever participated in. Special stations, with special callsigns, activate each of the original 13 colonies in what would become the United States. These include the coastal states we're all familiar with today, but not Maine (which was part of MA at the time), and not

Vermont (which didn't exist until 1791 when the US accepted the nation of the Vermont Republic into the Union).

Beyond the individual colony stations there are a few bonus stations as well. The stations can and will QSL, and participants in the special contest get an award as well.

The contest is a yearly event and each year both the QSL for the colony stations and the overall certificate is designed from scratch. This year they are search for a designer for the MA QSL card for the 2020 Thirteen Colonies Contest. The QSL cards follow a general theme each year.
